- \_\_\_1. A bishop, priest, or deacon can administer Confirmation.
- 2. "Christ" means "anointed," and is taken from the Greek word *christos*.
- \_\_\_\_3. The first time Mary is overshadowed by the Holy Spirit is Pentecost.
- \_\_\_\_4. The Holy Spirit is the Third Part of the Holy Trinity.
- \_\_5. When Father Jack was Confirmed as a boy, the bishop referred to him by his first name
  \_\_John—when confirming him, saying, "John, be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit."
- 6. Infants have never been Confirmed, and should never be Confirmed.

  - D. Did I embrace Mary today as my Mother in the order of grace by praying with her and behaving like one of her spiritual children?
