THE EUCHARIST—HOLY COMMUNION WITH GOD AND ALL THE HOLY ANGELS AND SAINTS

- I. Some Old Testament "Types"
 - A. The Tree of Life in the Garden of Eden (Genesis 2:9/3:22-23)
 - 1. If man eats the fruit from this tree he will live forever.
 - 2. "If anyone eats this bread, he will live forever" (John 6:51)
 - B. Melchizedek—"King of Righteousness" (Genesis 14:18-20)
 - Priest AND King
 - 2. King of Salem (Peace)—Later called "Jerusalem"
 - 3. Mysterious genealogy: Where is he from and who are his parents?
 - 4. Offers "bread and wine"
 - C. Abraham/Isaac (Genesis 22:1-19)
 - 1. Sacrifice/Wood/Mountain
 - 2. "God will provide Himself the lamb for a burnt offering, my son" (Genesis 22:9)—"a ram, caught in a thicket by his horns" (Genesis 22:13)
 - 3. "Behold, the Lamb of God, Who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29)
 - D. Moses
 - 1. Passover (Exodus 12)
 - a. Household eats a slain Paschal lamb
 - b. Blood marks the doorposts and lintel
 - c. Slain lamb eaten with unleavened bread and bitter herbs
 - d. Unleavened bread eaten for the journey
 - 2. Manna (Exodus 16)
 - a. Daily bread from Heaven
 - b. "I am the bread which came down from heaven." (John 6:41)
 - c. "The bread that I will give for the life of the world is My Flesh." (John 6:51)
 - E. David and the Ark of the Covenant (1 Samuel 6)
 - 1. David carries the Ark to Jerusalem in humility and joy.
 - 2. Ark "contained a golden urn holding the manna, and Aaron's rod that budded, and the tablets of the covenant; above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat." (Hebrews 9:4-5)
 - 3. Ark = Type of Mary (Revelation 11:19/12:1-2)
 - a. Woman radiant as the sun bears the Child Jesus ("Bread of Life").
 - b. Her son is priest and fruit of her womb.
 - c. Her son fulfills the Law with the Commandments of Love.
 - d. She is the Mother of Mercy greeted by an angel and overshadowed by the Holy Spirit.

- II. Christ's Institution of the Most Holy Eucharist
 - A. Upper Room of the Last Supper
 - 1. Gives His Body under the sign of bread
 - 2. Gives His Blood under the sign of wine
 - B. Sacrifice on the Cross of Calvary completes the Last Supper—The Fourth Cup
 - Eucharist—Both Supper and Sacrifice
 - 2. Supper/Sacrifice is NOT repeated but IS REPRESENTED IN AN UNBLOODY MANNER (SACRAMENTALLY).
 - a. Truly, really, substantially
 - b. Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity
 - C. Theological Terminology
 - 1. Presence of Christ under the Eucharistic signs
 - a. True—Actual, not only symbolic
 - b. Real—Objectively, not just subjectively in a believer's mind
 - c. Substantial—Not just spiritual, but the whole Christ: Body/Blood/ Soul/Divinity
 - 2. Transubstantiation—"the change of the whole substance of bread into the substance of the Body of Christ and of the whole substance of wine into the substance of the Blood" (CCCC#283)
 - a. Accidents/Species—What is perceived with the physical senses
 - b. Double Consecration: Signifies the Sacrifice
 - c. Concomitance—the WHOLE CHRIST is present under either species, Bread (B/B/S/D) or Wine (B/B/S/D), whether just a particle of a Host or a drop of the Precious Blood
- III. Holy Sacrifice of the Mass/Holy Eucharist = Worship in Spirit and in Truth
 - A. Real Situation: Unworthy because of sin but washed clean because of mercy
 - B. Real Vision: Liturgy of the Word—The Word Proclaimed
 - C. Real Love—Holy Communion: Liturgy of the Eucharist—The Word Made Flesh
 - D. Real Life: "Go in peace"; "Go and proclaim the Gospel of the Lord."
 - 1. On-going conversion to holiness as a disciple and son of God
 - 2. On-going mission of mercy (love) as an Apostle

1.	From the Gospel, we know that Christ might actually keep his followers from recognizing
	Him in His risen Body to make Himself known instead by talking to them about Scripture and by breaking bread to give to them.

8.	Christ's Gospel that we read in the New Testament could be understood completely
	without the help of the Old Testament.
9.	Receiving Holy Communion is the same as cannibalism.
10.	After transubstantiation of the bread into Christ's Body, and the wine into Christ's Blood,
	Christ is really present ONLY to those who have faith, and not to those without faith.
