### **SUMMARY**

- I. Sacraments—Signs from Heaven uniting us to our origin and directing us on our way to our destiny, which is perfect communion with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and with the holy angels and saints. Seven signs that effect what they signify:
  - A. REBIRTH from above through adoption by grace—BAPTISM
  - B. GROWTH in strength as a disciple to give witness as an apostle—CONFIRMATION
  - C. Spiritual NOURISHMENT for development in holiness and in communion with God and neighbor—EUCHARIST
  - D. HEALING of the soul wounded by sin—RECONCILIATION
  - E. DEEPER UNION with the Cross of Christ and ACCEPTANCE of His Way—ANOINTING OF THE SICK
  - F. LIVING in Communion and on Mission—HOLY ORDERS/MARRIAGE
- II. The Father's gifts to restore our life as His children
  - A. His Crucified Son—Baptism/Reconciliation/AOS/Eucharist/Holy Orders/Marriage
  - B. Mary, our Spiritual Mother—Icon of the Church as Mother
  - C. The Holy Spirit—Baptism/Confirmation

## FINAL QUESTIONS (T/F)

- 1. At the particular judgment, a person's soul separates from his or her body and, after God's judgment, goes either to Heaven, Hell, or Purgatory.
- 2. The Sacraments of Christian Initiation are Baptism, Reconciliation, and the Eucharist.
- 3. Everlasting love is ultimately determined uniquely by each individual human person according to his or her particular views and feelings.

- 5. In the case of an emergency, anyone can Baptize, provided that he or she has the intention of doing what the Church does.

- 13. Whenever we are sick, we know that Christ is with us, because He is the Suffering Servant Who "took our infirmities and bore our diseases."
- 14. The primary effect of the Anointing of the Sick is restoration of physical health.
- 15. A person is not responsible for accepting and embracing the sex of his or her birth.
- 16. A female in never truly made in God's image and likeness because God has revealed that He is male as shown in God the Father and God the Son.
- 17. God created "male and female" for conflict so that they become stronger through this conflict.
- 18. For a Marriage to be true in God's eyes, couples must intend a free, total, faithful, and fruitful covenant love.
