 - 3. Mockery of virtue, of holiness, and particularly of virginity and celibacy
 - 4. Scandals in the Church and in society
 - 5. Denial of objective truth, of right reason, and of divine revelation
- V. Suffering: The Way of the Cross
 - A. Acceptance of suffering and the offering of it through, with, and in Christ
 - B. Attacks on Suffering:
 - 1. Drugs and radical materialism
 - 2. Denial and morbid fear of suffering, and undue anxiety concerning it
 - 3. Self-absorption and lack of charity
 - 4. Denial of the existence of evil, of original sin, and of Christ crucified
- VI. Sacrifice: "Behold the Lamb of God!" (John 1:35)
 - A. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass—source, summit, and center of our life
 - B. Christ as priest and victim, shepherd and lamb

- C. Service to others—works of mercy
- D. Attacks on sacrifice:
 - 1. Individualism and atomization of society
 - 2. Greed and selfishness
 - 3. Destruction of the family and confusion regarding true service in general
- V. Holy Death: "Father, into Thy hands I commit my Spirit!" (Luke 23:46)
 - A. "It is finished": Christ on Calvary, giving His Life to the Father for us.
 - B. Christ conquers sin through death to give us grace and life.
 - C. Attacks against holy death:
 - 1. Assisted suicide and euthanasia
 - 2. Disregard for and alienation of the sick and the elderly
 - 3. Denial of the Gospel and of Christ crucified
