- D. In our "Magnificat" as children of Mary, we lift our minds and hearts to God—to adore Him, to thank Him, to obtain pardon for our sins and remission of punishment for them, to ask for graces and blessings for OURSELVES and for OTHERS
- E. We pray WITH: attention, conviction of our helpless and dependence upon God, a great desire for the graces we beg of Him, loving trust in His goodness, perseverance
